Wildlife to see

Crosshill Quarry (now a Nature Reserve) was abandoned as a working quarry in the early 1900's. It is a great example of natural change on a man-made site and has since become an exceptional refuge for wildlife.

FINISHING POINT

CLITHEROE INTERCHANGE (TRAIN STATION)



Visit the Platform Gallery

Take some time to look around the Platform Gallery (situated next to Clitheroe Interchange) to see an exciting display of contemporary craft with six changing exhibitions a year and a retail shop full of beautiful and unique handmade gifts.

You can get to Clitheroe Interchange, by bus or train

Getting started;

Turning left out of the Clitheroe Interchange Office, walk along Railway View Road, bearing left onto Waddington Road (heading towards Waddington). Walk about 3/4 mile (15 minutes) and you'll find the entrance to the Ribble Valley Sculpture Trail on your right.

Lunch Suggestion



From The Emporium walk up Moor Lane (350m) and turn left into the Castle Gates.

Head to The Emporium for a spot of lunch. Half coffee shop, wine bar and brasserie; half interior design superstore. The Emporium is genuinely unlike anywhere you have seen or been before.



Leave the Castle from the main gates and wander past the shops on Castle Street, turn left onto King Street straight ahead you'll find the Platform Gallery at the bottom of the road.

Explore the Ribble Valley Sculpture Trail

Discover a collection of intriguing artworks on a sculpture trail through Brungerley Park and Cross Hill Quarry Nature Reserve.

 **Approx length of time;** 1-1½ hours

Walking back towards Clitheroe Town Centre along the main shopping streets you'll be tempted by the many independent shops, some of which have been run by the same families for generations. Head down Moor Lane towards The Emporium.

Visit to Clitheroe Castle and Museum

Journey through 350 million years in the refurbished Museum, filled with interactive displays, then seek out the many treasures lying within the Castle's sixteen acres of grounds.
