## Tramper trek along the Priory Trials

Take all the family for a tramp along the Grizedale Valley and Scorton. You can hire a Wyresdale Wheels for All off-road capable motorised wheelchair to explore the countryside of the area. To book use of a tramper call 01524 791329 / 01253 863100

## Cycle ride around Scorton & Calder Vale

Follow the Scorton cycle ride along quiet country lanes to Brock Mill Picnic site. Along the way you could visit Calder Vale village or Cobble Hey Gardens to explore the industrial heritage and farm wildlife of the area.

**Approx length of time; 2-3 hours**

### Wildlife to see

Look up and you might see Buzzards over the skies around Nicky Nook. Along the River Brock near the picnic site see if you can spot Dipper and Grey Wagtails.

## Fishing at Cleveley Mere

Cast a line and enjoy a spot of fishing on the 24 acre fly-fishing lake set in the 38 acre nature reserve. Booking required.

Either re-fuel at one of the cafes in the village of Scorton or pack yourself a picnic using local Lancashire produce and stop at one of the many view points along the walk.


Walk along the Wyre Way for lunch in Scorton.

We saw bluebells and wild garlick in Wyreside Valley.



## Walk the Wyre Way

Follow the Wyre Way from Scorton up to Abbeystead passing fishing lakes along the way and then retrace your steps for a lovely walk in ancient woodlands alongside the River Wyre. Look out for industrial heritage around Dolphinholme village. Return to Scorton and catch the Super 8 bus back to Garstang
